## Council Highlights—November 12, 2019

Pastor Bev led an opening prayer.

Secretary's minutes were reviewed and amended. Treasurer and Financial Secretary's reports were reviewed and accepted.

Patty reported on all the groups renting space in the church and where they stand with their payments.

Council reviewed the proposed budget and number of pledges; it was determined that we need more pledges.

The Transition Team presented their report and answered questions from the council. A *Ministry Site Profile* report was given to council for review. It is being completed by the Team.

Sarah Moening from the Bishop's office will attend the January council meeting to meet with the council, Transition Team, and the Call Committee.

Ryan has received a signed grant from the Foundation to help pay for the floor.

### Pastor's Report

Pastor Bev will be on vacation November 18–December 14. Pastoral care will be handled by Pastor Barb Lemke November 18–23 and December 1–14, with Pastor Neil covering November 24–30.

Pastor Bev has requested that her last Sunday be December 22 and her last worship services be on December 24.

### New Business:

Kinna and the OHANA Youth are doing another tamale fundraiser so they are busy collecting orders. An Affirmation of Baptism class began November 10 and will run through May 10, 2020.

Council voted to accept Patty's offer to continue with her Financial Secretary duties for the remainder of her term after her move to Oklahoma.

Stewardship's *Time and Talent* sheets will be given out on December 1 and collected during worship on December 15.

### Usage Requests:

- It was voted to allow Purple Mountain Karate to move to the Fellowship Hall as they have outgrown the West Room. They will also add a belt class every Saturday night 5:30–8 p.m. Also approved was a request for a one-time use of the Fellowship Hall on the evening of November 24.
- The Indonesian congregation requested the use of Sanctuary on December 7 at 5 p.m. until they are through. Council agreed.

### Call Committee

Pastor presented the council with *Phase 111 of The Call Process* and a printout of what our constitution requires for a call committee.

Council then submitted names for a Call Committee. People will be contacted and asked to serve.

Meeting ended with the Lord's Prayer.

**Stepping Up in 2020** is off to a slower start than in years past. So far we have only received 47 pledges with a total of a little over \$107,000 which is only 59% towards our 2020 budget. The *Time and Talent* sheets will be handed out Sundays, December 1 and 8, and will be mailed to those who are unable to attend those services. The *Time and Talent* sheets need to be turned in Sunday, December 15, which happens to be the same Sunday as our Congregational Meeting.

## **Stewardship for Advent and Christmas**

Our thoughtful practices for Advent and Christmas not only make for good stewardship of your time, talents, relationships and money, they also help us to draw near to Our Lord and experience God's greatest gift to us—His Son, Jesus.

Many of us cherish everything about the Christmas season—except those incessant advertisements that tell us to buy this and that. We ask, “Where is Jesus in all this commercialism?” This is the right question to ask. Though it asks us to examine every aspect our lives, stewardship particularly challenges us to question the role money plays in our personal lives and our culture.

Christmas presents are wonderful expressions of love that make both giver and recipient feel good. At the same time, we want to be wary of advertising's lure to make us overspend, or to think that the cost of our gift is proportionate to our love. Do we think about this as we are giving our gifts to God and St. Mark's?

Most of all, we need to be sure that the main point of our Christmas is not the gifts we give, but the gift we receive from God, his love, forgiveness and his Son. Here are a few ideas:

- Attend worship regularly in Advent and the Christmas season.
- Pray about your *Time and Talent* sheet and how you can step up for next year.
- Prayerfully read Advent daily devotions.
- Give of your time—not just now, but all year long.
- Play religious themed Christmas music.
- Instead of buying a present, make a donation to a charitable organization in honor of your loved one.
- Make a generous year-end contribution to this congregation.
- Pray about our congregation's mission and ministry together.
- Pray about our future together as Christ's Church.

May you find God's favor now and all of the year ahead.

# WORSHIP LIFE AT ST. MARK'S

---

## December 2019

### **Sunday, December 1, 2019 ~ First Sunday of Advent**

The new church year begins with a wake-up call: Christ is coming soon! In today's readings both Paul and Jesus challenge us to wake from sleep, for we know neither the day nor hour of the Lord's coming. Isaiah proclaims the day when God will gather all people on the holy mountain and there will be no more war or suffering. Though we vigilantly watch for the promised day of salvation, we wait for what we already have: Christ comes among us this day as the word and meal that strengthens our faith in the promises of God.

### **Sunday, December 8, 2019 ~ Second Sunday of Advent**

*\* Second Sunday of the month – food collection for St. Mark's Pantry and Aurora Interfaith Community Services*

At the heart of our Advent preparation stands John the Baptist, who calls us to repent and make a new beginning. As the darkness increases we turn toward the approaching light of Christ. For Christians he is the root of Jesse, the righteous judge who welcomes all, especially the poor and meek of the earth. We wait with hope for that day when the wolf will dwell with the lamb, and there will be no more hurt or destruction. From the Lord's table we are sent in the spirit of John the Baptist to proclaim that in Christ the kingdom of God has come near.

### **Sunday, December 15, 2019 ~ Third Sunday of Advent**

A note of joyful expectation marks today's worship. Isaiah announces that the desert shall rejoice and blossom, and Jesus points to the unexpected and transforming signs of God's reign. We wait with patience for the coming of the Lord, even as we rejoice at his presence among us this day: in word and holy supper, in church and in our homes, in silent reflection and in works of justice and love. We pray that God would open our eyes and ears to the wonders of Christ's advent among us.

### **Sunday, December 22, 2019 ~ Fourth Sunday of Advent**

Today Isaiah prophesies that a young woman will bear a son and name him Emmanuel. The gospel is Matthew's account of the annunciation and birth of the one named Emmanuel, God-with-us. During these final days of Advent we pray, "O come, O come, Emmanuel," a beloved hymn based on the O Antiphons, ancient prayers appointed for the seven days preceding Christmas. On this final Sunday of Advent we prepare to celebrate the birth of the one born to save us from the power of sin and death.

### **Monday, December 24, 2018 ~ Nativity of Our Lord: Christmas Eve**

In winter's deepest night, we welcome the light of the Christ child. Isaiah declares that the light of the long-promised king will illumine the world and bring endless peace and justice. Paul reminds us that the grace of God through Jesus Christ brings salvation to all people. The angels declare that Jesus' birth is good and joyful news for everyone, including lowly shepherds. Filled with the light that shines in our lives, we go forth to share the light of Christ with the whole world.

### **Sunday, December 29, 2019 ~ First Sunday of Christmas**

St. Mark's Women will lead us in a celebration of and reflection on Christmas centered around lessons and carols. *There will be no communion at this service.*
