Congregational Meeting Highlights—December 15, 2019

President Gohl opened meeting with Pastor Bev leading a prayer.

Discussion on Transition Team's Report of primary focus for the future:

1. Grow the church and receive new members
2. Get more youth and families involved
3. Continue our outreach programs: Wed. meals, Aurora Warms the Night, God's Work Our Hand, ESL, ACTS, and food pantry
4. Identified what our body of Christ within this neighborhood should consist of

Financial Health of the Church:

Giving is not keeping up with budget. We are \$30,765 under approved budget from last year. Due to some claims made, the insurance for the church has gone up significantly. Ryan asked people with Thrivent to direct their Choice Dollars to St. Mark's or charity of their choice. The budget will now be published each week in the bulletin and quarterly statements will be given to those who pledge.

In order to cut costs, it was decided to call a 1/2–3/4 time pastor and ask the office manager to work more hours with a raise in pay.

The proposed budget was discussed followed by a silent vote. It was accepted with a vote result of 46 'yes' votes versus six 'no' votes.

Other Business

- Bill Stephenson will be our male representative at the Synod Assembly in 2020.
- Members of the Transition Team were thanked for their service to our congregation in the process of preparing to call a new pastor.
- Members of the Call Committee were introduced and will consist of: Dorie Gerhardt, Norma Duncan, Michele Gohl, Clark Gilbert, and Ken Barger. Ryan will sit in as President of council, and is looking for one or two alternates.
- Council positions reaching term limits are: President, Treasurer, Financial Secretary, Parish Ed, and we still need someone to represent Building and Grounds.
- Shirley Kerezsi, Anne Barger, and Bernette Douin volunteered and were approved to serve as lay members from the congregation on the Nominating Committee. Council will appoint two members more to serve on committee.

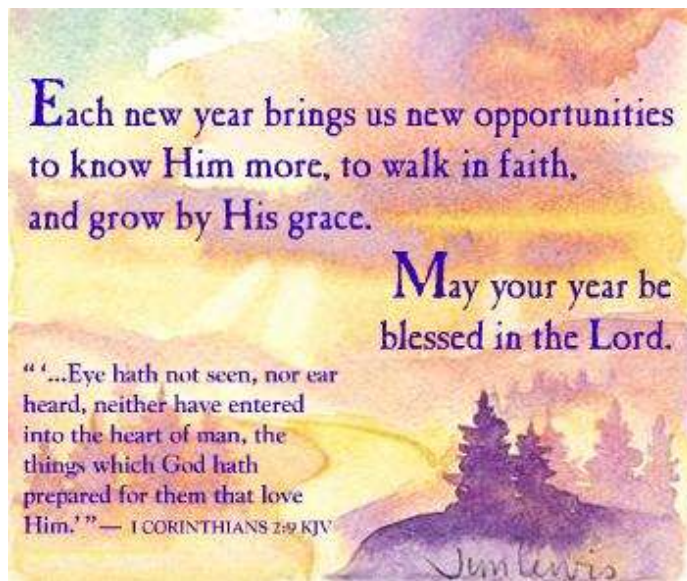

WORSHIP LIFE AT ST. MARK'S

January 2020

Sunday, January 5, 2020 ~ Second Sunday of Christmas

Within the gospel reading's profound words lies the simple message that God is revealed in a human person. Though we may try to understand how the Word existed with God from the beginning of time, the wonder we celebrate at Christmas is that the Word continues to dwell among us. Christ comes among us in the gathered assembly, the scriptures, the waters of new birth, and the bread and the wine. Through these ordinary gifts we receive the fullness of God's grace and truth.

Sunday, January 12, 2020 ~ Baptism of Our Lord

** Second Sunday of the month – food collection for St. Mark's Pantry and Aurora Interfaith Community Services*

In the waters of the Jordan, Jesus is revealed as the beloved Son of God. Through this great epiphany, Jesus fulfills all righteousness and becomes the servant of God who will bring forth justice and be a light to the nations. In the waters of baptism we too are washed by the Word, anointed by the Spirit, and named God's beloved children. Our baptismal mission is to proclaim good news to all who are oppressed or in need of God's healing.

Sunday, January 19, 2020 ~ Second Sunday after Epiphany

Today's gospel opens with further reflection on Jesus' baptism. He is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world and the one anointed by the Spirit. In the liturgy we come and see Christ revealed among us in word and meal. We go forth to invite others to come and worship the Holy One and to receive the gifts of grace and peace made known among us.

Sunday, January 26, 2020 ~ Third Sunday after Epiphany

Jesus begins his public ministry by calling fishers to leave their nets and follow him. In Jesus the kingdom of God has come near. We who have walked in darkness have seen a great light. We see this light most profoundly in the cross—as God suffers with us and all who are oppressed by sickness, sin, or evil. Light dawns for us as we gather around the word, the font, and the holy table. We are then sent to share the good news that others may be “caught” in the net of God's grace and mercy.
